Welcome to Seymour

Welcome to the small country town of Seymour Victoria. This lovely little town is located in North East Victoria and is approximately an hour out of Melbourne, travelling north along the Hume Freeway to Sydney.

Seymour is where the first ANRCI /NCRC National Rabbit Extravaganza is being held. The Northern Country Rabbit Club also holds their shows in the town of Seymour.

Seymour has an approximate populations of around 6000 and this is supplemented by the Puckapunyal army base which is located about five minutes out of town. It's a common sight to see the army trucks trundling through and of course men and women in uniform. Very much a part of life in Seymour.

Seymour was established in 1839 and is an important rail hub for the Sydney to Melbourne railway and also the Goulburn Valley railway. Trains run to Melbourne every hour from Seymour, making the city very accessible as far as working is concerned.

The shopping in Seymour is pretty good for a rural town as well. You will find *Target Country, Millers, Woolworths and Aldi and IGA* in the town and fast food outlets *McDonalds, KFC and La Porchetta,* as well as several Indian restaurants, Chinese restaurants and coffee shops

Seymour also has very good accommodation available with three motels, two caravan parks and various Bed & Breakfast locations available. As well there are three hotels (one a bistro in the main street) that offer a lovely choice of meals.

Seymour also has two large medical clinics and a hospital that has a 24hour after hours service.. should you be unfortunate enough to need it.

To attend the ANCRI/NCRC extravaganza you will be heading to Kings Park: To do this, if you are coming FROM the south, you will turn Right at TALLAROOK St.. travel a short distance up the road and you will find the large park (which comprises the football ground) on your right. From there you will see the large green shed which is your destination.

To come FROM the north, you will obviously turn left into Tallarook St and then follow the directions to Kings Park.

Be warned.. in March our weather is very unpredictable. It might be hot.. or it might be temperate, or it could be quite cool (not cold), so pack a bit of everything. USUALLY the weather in late March is starting to cool down, so it should be very pleasant. However we do get years where it's still pretty warm in late March.

This is just a very brief summary of the town. Those of us that live in the district hope that you enjoy your stay.



SPINNING DISPLAY AND FIBRE SHOW

Turn, turn, turn - round and round turns the wheel of life, and shadowing it spins our wheels of oak and cedar, magically transforming straw into gold as in the days of yore.

Well, there are a few processes in between these days: adorable bunnies eating that straw, (or more likely premium oats and rye), then growing amazing coats of Angora, Swiss Fox, Cashmere Lop and Jersey.

Gently combed and shorn, this beautifully soft and fine natural fibre is then spun into the most luxurious yarn in the world, ready to craft into heavenly garments.

Rabbit fibre has the greatest warmth-per-weight ratio of any fibre, can be worn next to the skin, is gentle enough for babies and needs NO chemicals to clean before processing.


















SPINNING DISPLAY AND FIBRE SHOW

Rabbit fibre has the greatest warmth-per-weight ratio of any fibre, can be worn next to the skin, is gentle enough for babies and needs NO chemicals to clean before processing.

Wool can be spun straight from the bunny, then knitted, crocheted, woven or felted into garments ready to wear.

Come to our Fibre and Long-Hair Rabbit shows at the Rabbit Extravaganza in March and see this rare cottage industry in action.

There will be a display of spinning as well as examples of the many different crafts that can be used with this beautiful luxury fibre. And of course, there will be adorable, cuddly, fluffy bunnies to meet and greet and entertain you.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBWISSIONS FOR FIBRE SHOW

- 1. Fibre must come from the saddle of the rabbit (back and sides) and must NOT include any leg, belly or "bum" wool.
- 2. Samples must be CLEAN no dandruff, no bits of chaff, and obviously not stained or smelly in any way.
- 3. Must be taken from the rabbit within last 12 months (so no samples previously entered in the 2012 shows!)
- 4. Fibre should be arranged, if possible, with the staple all facing the same way, and stored in either zip-lock bags or lidded plastic containers. Sheets of baking paper may be placed between layers to keep fibre flat and facing the same way. This storage helps prevent the wool from turning into a big felted ball in transit.
- 5. Ideally we'd like to see larger samples, but quality is preferred to quantity.
- 6. Only one rabbit's single shearing per entry please, as same rabbit produces different quality and colour over the seasons. (and of course we don't want a heap of white rabbits all having their coats jumbled together as one example!)
